Senator Rusty Black

Sen. Rusty Black has represented district 12 in Northwest Missouri since he was elected in 2022, having served six years in the Missouri House of Representatives prior to his senate bid. In addition to his legislative career, he spent 33 years as an agriculture educator.

As a policymaker, Sen. Black has earned a reputation as a bridge builder who can bring stakeholders together to find consensus – a benefit to his constituents and the state, as a whole. He has led efforts to improve the lives of veterans, expand the scope of practice for health care professionals and increase access to early childcare and afterschool programing.

During the past two years, Sen. Black has worked closely with afterschool advocates, including his wife, Karie, who was formerly the director of the Power Up afterschool program at the North Missouri Center for Youth and Families in Chillicothe. He has championed policy to increase access to afterschool programs, deftly maneuvering through much-needed legislation and passing it within a single legislative session.

The afterschool community owes Sen. Black a debt of gratitude for listening to our needs and putting them into action.




